

## Hospital Medicine Grand Rounds (July 2025-June 2026) High-quality evidence from observational data: Why preoperative stress testing fails to improve patient outcomes

Monthly faculty development lecture series for hospital medicine, on a broad range of updates in clinical topics within internal medicine subspecialities. Focus will be on clinical updates for hospitalists.

For this year we will review preoperative evaluation and best practices in high value care, preoperative cardiac evaluation and testing, sickle cell disease, heart failure management, management of alcohol and opioid withdrawal, gastrointestinal hemorrhage, cirrhosis, renal transplant emergencies, thromboembolism risk assessment and management, rheumatologic emergencies, acute kidney injury, respiratory failure and COPD, and traumatic injuries in the elderly as these are the areas of greatest need for knowledge updates within our group.

The focus of this symposium will be to update hospitalists in the latest diagnostic and treatment options for the clinical topics listed above. The associated topics are meant to enhance the understanding of these topics within hospital medicine as these are common disorders treated on our inpatient service.
