Engaging the academic physician in an interactive virtual seminar, this faculty development series focuses on improving the physician as an educator and mentor for undergraduate and graduate medical trainees.

Sessions strive to improve the participant's understanding of adult learning theory while providing skills to put it into action in their day-to-day clinical learning environments.

Skill building in the areas of both bedside and classroom teaching, learner evaluation, and giving and receiving feedback are emphasized, including using novel or emerging techniques as published in recent educational literature. Additionally, some sessions each year focus on the academic clinician as mentor and leader in both clinical and research realms.

### **Objectives**

- 1 Demonstrate effective navigation of the BMJ Best Practice tool, including the Comorbidities Manager, to support evidence-based decision-making within the clinical workflow when treating patients with multiple conditions
- 2 Evaluate opportunities to embed BMJ Best Practice into curricula and unit-based teaching to support learners in providing safe and comprehensive care
- 3 Engage in a continuing medical education activity that supports practical skill development when using a digital clinical decision support tool to improve patient care and health outcomes
