#### **COURSE OVERVIEW**

Designed for healthcare professionals specializing in Gastroenterology, Hepatology, Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, General Surgery, Colorectal Surgery, and Gynecology, this annual program will examine the medical conditions that are unique to women, occur more frequently in women, or present differently in women.

By utilizing emerging scientific and clinical evidence, experts will provide updated approaches to the diagnosis, management, and treatment of common gastrointestinal disorders aimed to improve the care of female patients.

#### LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Differentiate the causes and treatment of dysphagia in female and male patients.
- Discuss barriers faced by women in medicine to become an influential leader.
- Compare the approaches and outcomes of surgical management of GERD for female and male patients.

- Distinguish the gender differences in the indications for liver biopsy in patients with chronic hepatitis.

- Use the knowledge of the healthcare team to holistically care for patients.
